- COOP: EM has presented two cycles of a three-part workshop to County agencies. A third cycle will take place in October. This workshop goes step-bystep through the creation of COOP plans in the BOLD system. In 2023, EM will be able to offer this workshop to city and other organizations.
- Mitigation: Money is available for projects related to winter storms through mid-October. Contact Josh Taylor at itaylor@douglascountyks.org for more information.
- Grants:
 - O HMEP:
 - 2022: HMEP Grant funds paid for a full-scale hazardous materials transportation incident exercise, which took place on September 23rd. Several community agencies and partners participated, and an After Action Meeting is scheduled for October 28th.
 - 2023: EM's proposal for a 2023 gap analysis to look at our whole program was approved.
 - EMPG: \$10,000 additional dollars were approved to support county EM planning positions. The EMPG application for 2022 is due at the end of October.
- ARPA Project Updates:
 - EOC-A Improvements: waiting on bids, and some equipment has been ordered
 - Alternate EOC Improvements: initial planning has begun, looking for contractors to bid
 - New Vehicle: Reached out to Ford and Chevy and have gotten one estimate so far
 - CERT Trailer: Have only gotten 1 bid so far, planning for needed equipment
 - Siren Projects (Digipeater and cellular backup): Met with Blue Valley Public Safety, who have ordered equipment. Installation planning will be the next step.
 - PPE: The first order of rain coats for volunteers is in process.
- Volunteer Groups (CERT, ACT, Skywarn)
 - o Volunteers have been assisting with Accountability at KU Home football games.
 - Volunteers and staff provided communications accountability for the Great Kaw Adventure Race on October 1st.
- Outreach and Preparedness:
 - The next CERT Weekend Class is scheduled for October 14-16.
 - Jillian and Robert attended the Kansas Emergency Managers Conference in September; Jillian taught a pre-conference class.
 - September was National Preparedness Month; social media was used to promote preparedness and provide information to the community.

 - Burn Resolution: EM is working with partners as well as local and state officials on potentially reworking the Burn Resolution and updating communication with the public. The current DA is interested in enforcing the burn ban.

- Jamie Hofling: Douglas County Sustainability Department will be holding a series of focus groups as part of their development of a county-wide Climate Action Plan.
- Matthew Faulk: The Bert Nash facility had a small electrical fire last month which allowed for a chance to exercise and then improve plans. Bert Nash uses the Headcount Accountability app to track staff in such emergencies.

- John Stipetich: A new assistant director for Emergency Management has been hired at KU and will begin soon. A campus-wide EOC-focused active shooter tabletop exercise will take place in November.

- Lee Sekavec: The Kansas HazMat Symposium will take place in Wichita November 14-16.
- Derek Bland: Baldwin City is hosting the Maple Leaf Festival October 15-16. Additionally, Derek is seeking speakers in the environmental sciences area to speak to students at his junior high school.
