	Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2021, this historic farmstead
11:20am - 12pm	features a well-preserved barn constructed in 1900.

Event Details:

- Carpooling: We will be traveling via individual cars for this group barn tour. We encourage attendees, as they wish and as they are able, to carpool to reduce the number of cars that will be traveling on this tour. We will be organizing as a group in Lecompton at the Community Pride Building and can facilitate carpool arrangements then, but attendees are welcome to prearrange carpooling with friends and neighbors if they so wish.
- Accessibility: Access to certain sites on the tour may be limited for attendees with mobility
 concerns. Most sites will be accessed via gravel driveways or walkways, so there will be some
