

The person submitting such documents is responsible for distributing copies of the documents to all attorneys of record and involved agencies (e.g., CASA and other service providers).

All agencies (including governmental departments and agencies) and attorneys appearing in CINC or JV cases must provide the Clerk of the District Court with an electronic mail address to which they wish to have documents sent. The Court's electronic mail address for filing CINC and JV documents is jcjvclerk@douglascounty.com.

The Clerk's office will distribute file-stamped court issued documents to attorneys, government representatives and agencies by e-mail as directed by the Court. The clerk will send copies of all legal documents to parties, interested parties and child placement providers by first class mail unless such person requests that such documents be distributed to them by electronic mail after filing with the clerk a waiver of mail service in the form attached to this administrative order.

Parties submitting social history documents must file a cover sheet with the documents in the format set forth below. Parties filing any other document with the Clerk of the District Court shall also file a cover sheet containing the information stated in Paragraphs 1-4 below clearly set forth in the top half of the document and the information stated in Paragraph 5 below set forth in the bottom half of the document, to wit:

- Case Number. The case number, including the full four digit year, case type, and full case number assigned to the case. If the party submitting the document submits the document for more than one case, the full case numbers for all cases in which the document is being submitted must be set out in the cover sheet.
- 2. Last name, first name, year of birth of child(ren) who is/are the subject of the document or report;
- 3. **Type of Document** (e.g., case plan, report, evaluation), name of entity submitting it, and date of report;
- 4. Date, time, and location of hearing if applicable. A document that is filed, but not for a specific hearing, need not contain a hearing date, time and location.
- 5. A list of those persons who have been given copies of the document.

The Clerk of the District Court shall send copies of this order to all persons or entities currently filing reports with the court and to all new persons or entities when the court orders such person or entity to prepare a report for the court.

- The Court is concerned about the safety of all persons who are Court employees, are summoned to court, or appear in Court as jurors, witnesses, attorneys or litigants.
- 2. An integral part of any Court's duty to administer justice and fairly adjudicate disputes is the duty to insure that all parties have the opportunity to advance their causes in a safe, civil and fair atmosphere. It is fundamental principal of law that a trial Court is vested with the discretion to provide for security within a courtroom and within any Court areas of operation. In order to carry out this function the Court may take measures to promote the safety of Court officers and employees, attorneys, litigants, and members of the public while they are conducting the business of the Judicial Branch wherever it may occur.
- 3. As one of the three separate branches of government the Court has inherent power and authority to set policy regarding matters reasonably necessary for the proper functioning of the judiciary, and the orderly and efficient exercise of the administration of justice. The Court has the inherent power and authority to impose security

- measures to provide for the safety of all persons who are in Courtrooms or Court areas of operation.
- 4. For the purposes of this Administrative Order, "Courtroom or any Court areas of operation" means those areas in any building that are used for Court proceedings or to conduct Court-related business, including, but not limited to, Courtrooms, ancillary Courtrooms, jury rooms, judges' chambers and the offices of the Clerk of the District Court, court reporters, Court Services Department, Community Corrections Department, Court Trustee, Court-Appointed Special Advocates, Citizen Review Boards, and any other offices and areas used for official Court business; together with waiting areas, corridors, and hallways adjacent thereto.
- 5. Except as otherwise provided within this Administrative Order, all persons, other than persons designated as Court Security Officers by the Douglas County Sheriff, are prohibited from carrying or possessing any weapon, including a firearm or explosive device, in the Courtrooms or Court areas of operation of the Seventh Judicial District of Kansas.
- 6. Nothing contained herein shall limit the authority of a Judge of this Judicial District to authorize or prohibit a law enforcement officer or Court security officer from possessing and carrying a firearm in that judge's Courtroom or Court area of operation.
- 7. Appropriate notice of this weapon restriction shall be posted in all Courtrooms and Court areas of operation of this Judicial District. This

Administrative Order will be enforced through the contempt power of the Court

Policy: Food and Meal Purchases

It is the ethical responsibility of every public servant to ensure that expenditures are in the interest of Douglas County, and are for legal, appropriate county business. We are entrusted by the citizens to be good stewards of their tax dollars. The purchase of food and/or meals for county employees should be in alignment with Federal guidelines.

Procedure: Food and Meal Purchases

Food purchases (meals/refreshments):

The Internal Revenue Service distinguishes between taxable and non-taxable meals.

Food the county will purchase and is non-taxable:

Meals directly related to business meetings. When the employee is asked to represent the county at meetings of exempt organizations, chamber of commerce, trade or professional associations and the meal is related and necessary to the meeting.

Meals provided to employees to <u>occasionally</u> enable them to work overtime or "work through" an unusually busy time. This does not include routinely occurring overtime.

Meals consumed by the employee on a county related trip that requires an overnight stay, see more in the Overnight Travel Section/per diem.

Food or beverage that does not comprise a complete meal (i.e. light refreshments) provided for:

- inter-agency meetings involving non-county staff
- meetings where the public is expected to attend

Unusual and specifically authorized circumstances may be approved by the Chief Judge for District Court or County Administrator or Asst. County Administrator for other departments.

Food the county will purchase, but the IRS considers a taxable benefit:

Meals purchased immediately before or after training in another city, but not requiring an overnight stay may be paid for by the county, if approved by the Department Head. However, this meal is a taxable benefit and will be accounted for by payroll.

In all above situations except Overnight Travel, employees may use the Pcard (see more information in Pcard section), or submit receipts for reimbursement. The maximum costs for meals purchased by the county are: breakfast \$ 10, lunch \$15 and dinner \$25. Reimbursement will be limited to the lower of the amount actually expended or the maximum costs allowed. Overnight travel will use a per diem, not Pcard.

Food the county will **not** purchase: (If an unallowable charge is made to the Pcard. The amount will be withheld from the employee's wages.)

The county will not pay for alcohol.

The county will not pay for food costs above the stated maximums, breakfast: \$ 10, lunch \$15 and dinner \$25.

The county will not purchase meals for non-county employees unless there is an appropriate work related reason to do so. (Food for witnesses, invited speakers, jurors are examples of appropriate work related reasons.)

The county will not pay for two employees to go out to lunch.

The county will not pay for a meal or light refreshments during a <u>routine</u> meeting held at meal time, during work hours.

The county will not pay for holiday, birthday, or seasonal meals.

Policy: Overnight Travel

Douglas County will pay for authorized expenditures incurred by County employees while traveling overnight as a function of their employment with Douglas County. The expenses must be consistent with this policy and the related procedures.

Procedure: Overnight Travel

A per diem allowance will be paid for meals related to a business trip with an overnight stay. Lodging and transportation should be purchased with the Pcard.

All overnight travel and per diem requests must be approved by the department head or those authorized to approve accounts payable vouchers for the department.

Per Diem Authorization form along with supporting document (e.g. meeting agenda or conference registration) must be turned in to Julie Clouse, Administrative Services, with adequate time to process before the trip. Forms turned in by **Wednesday**, will have checks available **Thursday** morning of the following week. The Per Diem Authorization form is on the Intranet under the "Forms and Documents" heading.

No manual checks will be issued for per diems.

<u>Do not use your Pcard for meals, if you have received a per diem allowance.</u> If an employee receives a per diem and then by mistake uses the Pcard for a meal, the amount will be withheld from the employee's wages.

Per diem rates will follow the rates provided by the U.S. General Services Administration. Currently, the standard IRS meal per diem is \$46. Some metro areas in the U.S. have higher per diem rates.

Partial travel days will have prorated per diem rates.

100% Travel begins before 7 AM or at desired location	Travel ends at or after 6 PM
75% Travel begins before 11 AM	Travel ends before 6 PM
50% Travel begins before 6 PM	Travel ends before 11 AM

If the event includes a meal, the corresponding amount (breakfast \$10, lunch \$15, dinner \$25) will be deducted from the per diem.

If the overnight travel is cancelled or cut short for any reason, the amount of the remaining per diem will be deducted from the employee's wages. The employee or department head will inform Accounts Payable, if this occurs.
