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Post 2025 Session

- Budget and Policy.
- No additional funding approved for community corrections grants.
- Delete \$10 million from the juvenile evidence-based practices (EBP) fund.
- Add \$2.2 million from EBP fund to the fund for JAG-K.
- Add \$1 million from EBP fund for the O'Connell Children's Shelter in Douglas County. (The Governor vetoed this funding but they Legislature overrode the veto.)

Juvenile Issues

- Status and future of Evidence Based Practices Fund.
- House Bill 2329: Changes to juvenile offender code, out-of-home placements, EBPF expenditures, pending action during 2026 session.

Interim Issues and Preparations for 2026

- 2025 Interim Joint Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice issues:
 - Community Corrections Funding Formula.
 - Consolidation of field services into a single agency.
 - Review judicial fees/surcharges; Explore community services and programs not addressed after SB 367, including residential settings.
 - Youth involved involved in crimes with firearms.
 - Review juveniles in offender registration act.

Interim Issues and Preparations for 2026

- Legislative Budget Process Year 2.
- Possible Legislation for 2026: HB 2329 juvenile services.
 - Juvenile Placement Matrix: Moderate/high risk facility placement option
 - Juvenile Sentencing Alternatives: Up to there 15-bed youth res. facilities, \$10 m EBPA
 - Possession and use of firearms. Direct facility placement 12-24 months.
 - Emergency shelters and therapeutic foster homes: Require contracting for beds.
 - Detention limits; risk override: Extend limit from 45 to 90 cumulative; firearm use direct direct placement override.

Other Legislation Still Alive

- HB 2312. Excluding certain offenders convicted of a nonperson felony from participation in certified drug abuse treatment programs and authorizing community correctional services officers to complete criminal risk-need assessments for divertees who are committed to such programs. Passed the House, in conference committee.
- HB 2192. Limiting or prohibiting work release for people convicted of a second or third offense of domestic battery. Passed House and Senate, in conference committee.
- HB 2327. Requiring the secretary of corrections to assist inmates with obtaining identification and employment related documentation prior to release from custody. Passed House and will be in conference committee.
