### C. AGENDA ITEMS:

1. **Food System Updates:**

- **Termination of Regional Food Business Centers Programs**  
On July 15, 2025 the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Brooke L. Rollins announced the termination of the Regional Food Business Centers (RFBC) program.
- **Kansas Local Food Summit**  
Summit taking place July 29-30 in Salina, KS
- **Gleaning Update**  
The Council previously discussed gleaning efforts in Douglas County. As a follow-up, After the Harvest ended operations at the end of 2024. Gleaning activities in the region are now being continued by: United People Power (UPP).
- **Summer Feeding Resource Guide**  
The Summer Feeding Resource Guide is now available and includes key resources for food access across the county.
- **Food Truck Roster**

A Douglas County Food Truck Roster is in development to support World Cup food entrepreneurship.

- **The Kansas Foodpreneur Bootcamp**

The Kansas Foodpreneur Bootcamp is a 6-week online training for aspiring food business owners, starting October 1, 2025, facilitated by the Online Restaurant Academy in partnership with Network Kansas and Kansas SBDCs. Registrations due by September 26, 2025.

2. **Kansas Food Action Network & Douglas County Legislative Priorities Timeline**

- Presenter: County staff
- The Kansas Food Action Network (KFAN) will host its statewide convening to vote on legislative recommendations. Date TBD (typically held in August). DCFPC representatives will be needed to attend and participate.
- Separately, the DCFPC must finalize its own recommendations for the Douglas County legislative priorities by the end of September 2025.

3. **Consideration of New DCFPC Working Group | Common Ground Farm Application Process:**

- Presenters: County staff and Leadership
- County staff have met with DCFPC leadership to explore the creation of a working group to co-develop a new, more equitable, and transparent incoming-farmer application and selection process for the Common Ground Farm.
- If approved, the working group will include DCFPC members and County staff to develop a new application and process for incoming farmers. Recommendations from the group will be brought back to the full Council for approval.
- Members of this working group may include but is not limited to: Tyler Lindquist, Emily Lysen, Quinlan Carttar, and Ben Sikes.

**ACTION:** Consider approving the formation of a temporary working group to support development of the revised Common Ground Farm application and selection process.

4. **Economic Development Working Group | World Cup Readiness:**

### **Local Food Business Support & Sustainable Practices**

- Presenter: Tyler Lindquist
- Proposal by Economic Development: Douglas County Food Policy Council (DCFPC) to support World Cup (WC) readiness by preparing local food businesses and promoting sustainable practices. DCFPC will partner with large event and multilingual ESO experts to deliver targeted training for mobile food vendors, including Spanish-speaking food entrepreneurs, focused on WC business readiness, safety, and permitting. To reduce food waste, DCFPC may also work with local food-compost entrepreneurs to integrate compost practices at WC events with an emphasis on mobile food vendors.
- Training expected to take place in Q1 OF 2026.

**ACTION:** Consider approval of DCFPC's role in supporting World Cup readiness through food business training and composting initiatives and authorize staff and partners to begin implementation planning.

#### **5. Proposal for a Curbside Compost Collection Pilot in Lawrence**

- Presenter: Dietrich Earnheart and Coco Castle
- Background: The FORWARD working group met on May 20, 2025, and developed a proposal for a pilot curbside compost collection program in Lawrence, KS. This is a followup effort from a presentation by Coco Castle, Owner & Director of Operations during the DCFPC April 21, 2025 full council meeting.
- Proposal Summary: The pilot aims to test the feasibility and effectiveness of curbside food waste collection for composting from residential households.

**ACTION:** Consider approval for the Douglas County Food Policy Council (DCFPC) FORWARD Working Group to advance a Curbside Compost Collection Pilot in Lawrence, and authorize County staff and relevant partners to support the preliminary study.

#### **6. Lawrence Farmers Market Permanent Location Feasibility Study and Community Engagement, Update**

- LFM Director of Development and DCFPC member Emily Lysen will provide an update on the Lawrence Farmers Market Permanent Location Feasibility Study and Community Engagement. The update will include the feasibility study and project timeline and opportunities for the DCFPC to support community engagement efforts at the farmers market, FidPick, Art in the Park, and Community Town Halls.
